News from Madagascar

Devotions



29 June 2010

Dear Friends in Christ:

Greetings in Jesus' name from Antsirabe! At this time, I would like to share two devotions with you. The first one was written for my home congregation during the month of June. The second one is for the month of July.

Jesus, the Light of the World

"When Jesus spoke to the people, He said, 'I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.'" John 8:12

"I am the Light of the world," was the theme for Dr. Elson's devotions at Ejeda Lutheran Hospital one morning when I was visiting there earlier this year. He continued by saying that "it is not the healthy who are in need of a Physician, but the sick."

The waiting room at the hospital was filled to capacity, with many people standing for devotions on that Tuesday morning. There were probably just as many out-patients attending this devotional service as there were hospital employees. Many of these out-patients do not know the Lord. They remain steeped in their ancestral beliefs, with the majority of them seeking medical care from a witch doctor or an evil spirit ritual before going to this Christian health center, as a last resort.

At Ejeda Lutheran Hospital, everyone who enters its doors hears the Word of God. They learn about Jesus the Great Physician, the Light of the world. Many of these non-Christians are healed of their physical ailments after prayer, medical treatment and care for which the hospital staff gives glory to the Lord. These patients and out-patients are reminded that there is only one way to heaven, through faith in Jesus Christ. Each of us has a choice of receiving Him or not.

This hospital is in existence because of God's Love, and because Jesus is the Light of the world, with His Light shining at this 60-bed hospital in rural southwestern Madagascar ... in the village of Ejeda.

Thank you, Lord Jesus, for being the Light of the world. May your Light shine through us, that we might be a witness to those with whom we come in contact. Amen

Freedom in Christ

Galatians 5:1, "Freedom is what we have — Christ has set us free! Stand, then, as free people, and do not allow yourselves to become slaves again.

On 26 June 2010, Madagascar celebrated their 50th anniversary of independence. The entire week preceding this date consisted of numerous activities.

One noteworthy observation of this celebration was the daily ecumenical services beginning on the 14th of June, in Antananarivo. These services were led by the FJKM or Protestant Reformed Church in Madagascar. A prayer service was held in a different FJKM church in the capital city each day. The reason for these prayer sessions is the the FJKM Church wanted to invite all the faithful to come to repentance, to turn back to God, and to place their confidence in Him. But most of all, to place themselves in His hands.

A medical co-worker of mine here in Madagascar sent me an email recently, stating that "we are busy praying for our nation (of Madagascar) which is in deep difficulty during this 50th year of liberty. But we have God's promise that He is always with us. Praise the Lord."

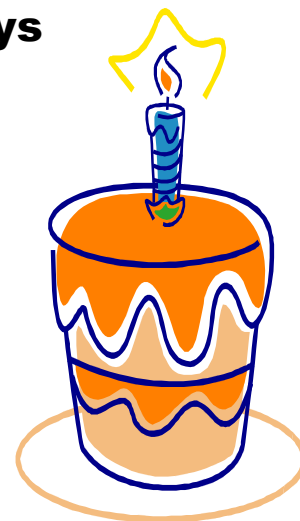

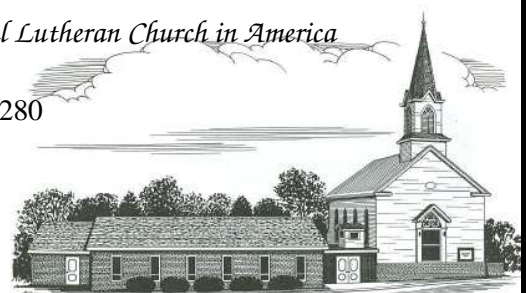
